Do you generate your own electricity?

Federal and state laws require Minnesota Power and other utilities to buy all electric energy that qualified small power producers and cogenerators offer for sale. These are referred to as "qualified facilities" and would be interconnected with our system. Small power producers typically generate electricity using a renewable resource such as solar or wind. Cogenerators produce both electricity and useful heat energy. These facilities may use a non-renewable fuel, such as oil or natural gas.
